In less than 15 years, The Presidents Cup has grown from little more than an idea to the incredible event it is today – a world-class competition that brings together the game's best in the spirit of goodwill and friendship. The Presidents Cup represents all that is good about golf and in 2009, fans will be treated to a display of competitive fire, unparalleled shot-making and incomparable sportsmanship. With a history of close class, dramatic finishes and rise-to-the-occasion heroics, The Presidents Cup 2009 promises to be the best yet.

Fred Couples was on the winning American side in the inaugural Presidents Cup in 1994. In an exceedingly popular choice, he and **Greg Norman** – two of the most well-liked and accomplished men to ever play the game- will captain the U.S. Team and International Team, respectively, at the 2009 Presidents Cup at Harding Park in San Francisco. The two replace Gary Player and Jack Nicklaus, who held their posts for the last three Presidents Cups. The two World Golf Hall of Famers helped move the biennial event to the forefront of the golf consciousness and instilled a spirit of camaraderie, as well as one of competition, that continues to this day.

In Couples and Norman, the Presidents Cup has its first two captains who have actually played in the event. They are both major champions, as well as former PGA Tour players of the year and leading money winners. Couples has a 9-5-2 record in four Presidents Cups. He is unbeaten in Singles and provided the winning point in 1996 when he beat Singh 2 and 1 at Robert Trent Jones Golf Club. Norman competed in the Presidents Cup three times and owns a 7-6-1 record, including a 3-1-1 mark at royal Melbourne in his native Australia 1998 when the International Team beat the Americans by nine points. That remains the only defeat for the U.S.

GOLF

Spyglass Hill Golf Course



This Robert Trent Jones design was beautiful but controversial when it opened in 1963. Alterations have settled the controversy, but the beauty remains just the same. Most fairways are tight and the pine trees often seem to stand in the line of play. Spyglass is long, technical, and some think it is too unforgiving; but one thing is sure, it remains one of Robert Trent Jones's best achievements and, one of the most difficult and beautiful tests of golf that the public can play.

Pebble Beach Golf Links



Jack Nicklaus has called Pebble Beach his favorite course. Many think it is the best in the country and certainly the most beautiful. The course sits by Carmel Bay and probably has the most scenic setting in all of golf. The course is difficult, but no matter how you play, it is the golfer's experience of a lifetime.

Spanish Bay Golf Links



The land available to the designers of this course was perfect links terrain: a gently rolling, ocean-side, windswept area of sand dunes and marshes. The Scottish influence can be observed everywhere on the course. The small greens are nestled between dunes, pot bunkers hide behind grassy mounds, and tees, fairways and greens were seeded with fescue grasses to provide the firm playing surface found on the old-world links.

Harding Park's layout follows the original routing as designed by architect Willie Watson in 1925. The course takes advantage of the property's existing topography, contours and vegetation. The predominant features include the towering Monterey Cypress trees and the nearby presence of Lake Merced. Harding's strategy and character have been substantially enhanced with the inclusion of several carefully placed bunkers and re-contoured green complexes. The addition of multiple teeing surfaces provides the course the flexibility to offer distinct playing characteristics that will challenge every golfer, from beginner to the most skilled player.

The Harding Park complex includes an outstanding executive nine-hole course known as the Fleming Golf Course. The Fleming nine has been revitalized to the same discerning standards and conditioning as Harding's re-creation, albeit shorter in length yet full of strategy and interest. Fleming plays to a par of 30, with a total yardage for the nine holes ranging from 1865 yards from the forward tees to 2165 yards from the regular tees. The three par fours and six par threes are an excellent alternative to Harding's championship layout, providing a comfortable setting for the beginning or learning golfer.

Harding Park also features a practice putting green and an all-season practice area with state-of-the-art TourTurf™ surface installed in both the teeing and landing areas.

INFORMATION

Eligibility Criteria

United States Team: The top 10 U.S. players who earned the most official PGA Tour money beginning with the 2007 Wyndham Championship through the 2009 PGA Championship, weighted as follows:

2007-2008	\$1 = 1 point
2009	\$1 = 2 points

Plus two captain's selections

International Team: The top 10 international players (excluding those eligible for the European Ryder Cup team) from the Official World Golf Ranking through the 2009 PGA Championship, plus to captain's selections.

Format

The Presidents Cup competition consists of 34 matches – 11 foursomes (alternate shot) and 11 four-ball (better ball) matches.

There are 12 single matches involving all players on the final Sunday. All matches are worth one point each, for a total of 34 points. There are no playoffs for foursomes or four-ball, with each side receiving $\frac{1}{2}$ point. Singles matches all square after 18 holes will go extra holes until a team winner is determined. In a change inspired by the events of The Presidents Cup 2003, if the match is deadlocked at the end of singles play, the competition will be deemed a tie and the teams will share The Presidents Cup.
